Founded in 2014, Roger & Donna Beery along with their children, Conch and Whitney set upon a calling for their rich family history, mutual respect for honesty and integrity in winemaking. Along with consulting winemaker Adam Lee, J. Cage Cellars honors two generations with one passion. Their philosophy is traditional and non-interventionist and they believe winemaking begins in the vineyard, while sourcing from small family growers that are some of the most respected in Sonoma County.

A very expressive Pinot Noir offering up beautiful aromatics and flavors of red fruit, and dark fruit with notes of baking spice and vanilla.

Quite structured on the palate with a lush mouth-feel that is balanced by food pairing acidity. Red and blue fruit flavors abound with a combination of the baking spice and vanilla notes, highlighted with hints of cinnamon.

The 20 acre El Coro Vineyard, in the Petaluma Gap sits high on a ridgetop where the vines are exposed to strong winds that bring the Pacific maritime air and fog through the Petaluma Gap. The wine is equal parts 828, 777, 667 and La Tâche Pinot Noir Clones.
